DISCIPLESHIP

GOAL: Living a Sacramental Life

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:16-20 (NRSV)

ACTION: The first Sunday after Epiphany at the end of the Christmas season each year, is Baptism of the Lord Sunday. It is always one of the first Sundays of the new year, and is a way great to focus our life and our year. In baptism, we are made to be new creatures in Christ. We are no longer our old self, but made new through the death and resurrection of Christ. What a wonderful reminder for the new year, to live into the new life that we have received. But we often get so busy that it's easy to fall into our old life and old habits. It is interesting that in the scripture above, Jesus calls us to go into the world and make disciples, but it doesn't stop at baptizing. Jesus continued on to include "teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded." This is key for us, and a great way to start out the new year.

Those who say they live in God should live their lives as Jesus did.

In the United Methodist Church, we practice two sacraments, Baptism and Communion, in accordance with the commands of Jesus. But Jesus showed us a full life and how to live, which included many more things than just the two sacraments. Sometimes we refer to objects or practices

that inspire us to devotion and the presence of God as *sacramentals*. If we reflect on the life of Jesus, we are reminded of His response to His parents to Him being the temple, "Where else would I be?", as one of those examples of how we are to live our life. We also see in Jesus a life lived in prayer and a life where grace abounds. It reminds me of Brother Lawrence and his book "The Practice of the Presence of God." This short book-- in our church library and online, and takes only a quick hour or so to read-- is the closest I have seen of someone living a totally sacramental life, a life of worship. I offer up this book as a great place to start if you want to explore what a sacramental life of worship might look like.

JOURNAL REFLECTION: What meaning do the sacraments have in my life? What is easy for me in living a life following Jesus? What makes it hard for me to live a life of worship and sacramental living?
