A NOTE FROM PASTOR MIKE

Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' Matthew 25: 44-45 (NRSV)

As I sit here and look out the window at the rain that has started, I am thinking about Punxsutawney Phil, and his forecast for six more weeks of winter. I don't know about any of you, but I think I have had it with this winter. We seem to have had many more days of frigid temperatures, and more than our share of snow, and please don't get me started about the ice....

I am also thinking about those in our community who may be lacking many of the things we all take for granted. We have our fair share of people in our community who are struggling financially, or may not have adequate food or clothing. There are those who may have a roof over their head, but may not have funds to pay for heat.

I bring this up to mention some of our missions which take on more importance in the winter months. Our Hat & Mitten Mission is an easy way that we can help provide items that may keep someone warm, by purchasing hats/mittens/gloves or even socks! We also provide Soup's On, which takes place in the months that have five Saturdays. Recipients can pick up a hot lunch (until it is safe to offer in- person dining again) to go. First Church Feeds is our monthly food pantry. Recipients receive approximately one month's supply of food including canned goods, dry goods, cereal, pasta, canned meats, frozen



meats, dairy products, fresh fruits, vegetables, bread, and other items. Our Blessing Box, although small in size, is frequented throughout the week. Items in need for this are canned foods, ramen noodles, oatmeal packets, tuna fish, individual applesauces, etc... Personal hygiene items are always well received. Our collection of coats has been beneficial for Heart4theCity, which is a mission church in East Akron/Tallmadge border. They have a store where recipients my purchase donated items at a very reduced price. They also host a weekly food pantry.

This passage from Matthew reminds us that God is everywhere. When we are in the midst of what feels like a never-ending winter, it can be hard to sense God's presence, or when we may encounter a stranger in need. Keep your eyes and your heart open as well, so that we can share God's love with the world, and remember that the person in need is a beloved child of God, and what we do or do not do for them, we do or do not do to Jesus himself!

Our First Church UMW unit was busy in 2020 and 2021 despite the limitations due to Covid. During the past two years, the circles met either by Zoom, phone calls, in the parking lot, or in person when able. Several mission projects were accomplished and donations were given during that time so the UMW was still able provide help to the community and the District UMW. In 2020, the UMW raised over \$7,000 that was used to meet our pledge to the District UMW and provide donations to various organizations. In 2021, the UMW raised over \$8,000 that

again was used to meet our pledge to the District UMW and provide funds to various organizations. The monies raised by the UMW come from members making pledges and the UMW fundraisers (that many of you support). Some of the organizations the UMW provided help to were: the Akron/Canton Regional Food Bank, Battered Women's Shelter, Faithful Servants, Family Promise, Flat Rock Homes, Inc., Good



Neighbors, Goodwill Industries, Open-M, Haven of Rest Ministries, Salvation Army, South Street Ministries, UMCOR and Heart4theCity.
