

# A NOTE FROM PASTOR JON

In May 2022, a new Methodist denomination was formed called the Global Methodist Church. This past year, about 11 churches from our conference (out of nearly 700 churches) opted to leave the United Methodist Church to join this new denomination, along with 3 of our approximately 500 active clergy. Other churches and clergy may choose to leave in the coming years, but I wanted to be clear about what has happened so far.

Just one month after this Africa University, a United Methodist institution of Higher Education, also made news as they recognized the graduation and achievements of 712 students from 18 African countries who have completed undergraduate and graduate programs in education, nursing, STEM, and public health. Many of these students are women who would have difficulty completing these programs without the presence of Africa University and the new women's dorm that we (and the other churches of the East Ohio conference) helped provide. In light of the start of the new denomination, I'm reiterating that I am committed to leading the church to remain United Methodist during this time. The good work of Jesus Christ through the United Methodist Church, like what we've been able to make possible through Africa University, is too important to me. *Based on what is being proposed by conservatives and progressives on this issue, local congregations will never have to vote about this issue so long as they intend to remain United Methodist.* For some of the reasons why I'm leading us this way, I'm sharing again with you an article that I wrote for you back in February 2019 about this possible church separation over how we engage in ministry with and to LGBTQ persons. Feel free to email or call me anytime if you have any questions about this.

First Church welcomes any and all persons as God's beloved children regardless of race, age, nationality, sexual orientation, background, etc. We have hosted an LGBTQ fellowship group and sexual orientation does not preclude a person in any other way from participating in the life of our church. This presents a tension for some, because though all persons are of sacred worth to God – "God loves us and there's nothing we can do about it" – still a young person growing up in our church who is LGBTQ is welcomed up until they would desire to be married or be called by God to licensed or ordained ministry in the church.

I want to repeat, all persons, regardless, are welcome at First Church and are invited into the life of following Jesus here. I grieve the division that rankles our global church over how we define marriage, sin, and how we welcome LGBTQ persons in our church. I also grieve the harm that is done as we continue to hold some persons of faith from being fully included in the life of the church. At times when discussions are happening on this issue, I feel like I am hearing the two mothers arguing to divide the baby in King Solomon's court.

I must say that I am the person I am today, the maturing follower of Jesus Christ, because of the things that are at stake in this debate in our church:

First, my relationship with God. We must do all that we can to allow any and all access to God's redeeming love (cf. Acts 15:19).

Second, I love the Bible. I love reading it, studying it, teaching, it, and attempting to live in obedience to its teachings. But I am mindful that some things were written for a particular context, like Paul's instructions about women keeping silent in church, the requirement that restrooms be located a certain distance away from the worship space in Deuteronomy 23, and the prohibitions against pork – (aren't we glad that Christianity is the only Abrahamic religion that allows BACON!). Some things in the Bible aren't meant to be applied forever but are best understood and interpreted within the community of faith. If you have more questions about this, come talk to me anytime.

Last, I am the person I am because participating in my Church has always forced me to be in relationships with people with whom I disagree. I have had Sunday school teachers, pastors, professors, and friends who were conservatives, moderates, liberals, Europeans, Americans, Asians, and Africans. This has made me a better human, a better Christian, and I want to raise my children in an environment like I was raised: to love God, to love Scripture, and to be surrounded both by people who are like us and who are different. I long to see the United Methodist Church, and First Church in the Falls, continue to be a place like this and I will continue to fight, love, and serve you and God to that end.



**Accessibility Improvements...** In the past few years the Trustee and Access Committees have recommended and completed projects which have made our building more accessible to everyone. Those projects have included:

- Updating the elevator
- Installing a chair lift
- Elevating the drain and access into the church from the driveway by St. John's.
- Flattening the door threshold by the St. John's entrance to make it wheelchair accessible.
- New sidewalks around the building.
- Windows in the breezeway doors for more visibility.
- Pew cutouts in the sanctuary.
- Installation of the automatic door opener for the breezeway entrance.

**Financial Peace...** Have you ever done your taxes, looked down at the number in the income box and wondered where it all went? Ever felt like there wasn't enough money to do all the important things you know you should be doing with it or wonder how to even do the important things in the first place? Ever been in a situa-



tion where you wanted to give to a good cause but didn't because you were trying to keep up with your

own bills? If so, the church is sponsoring another iteration of Financial Peace University and offering it again at a reduced price of \$75 per family with a \$25 rebate if you come to all ten classes. Classes will be from 4:00-6:00 PM starting on the second Sunday of September and going through November 20<sup>th</sup> excluding Halloween weekend. Childcare is available.
