Expectations and Understandings

<u>Psalm 13:1</u> – The Israelites understood themselves as God's suffering servant

Psalm 45:6 – they were expecting a returning king whom they needed but never got

The King Who Suffered

<u>Philippians 2:5-11</u> – Jesus brought these two expectations together in himself

<u>Hebrews 4:14-15</u> – He knows our pain and will be there for us whatever we face

<u>Questions for Reflection:</u> As the king who suffered, Jesus showed us what God is like. Why do you think complete self-sacrifice is the way that God chose to be revealed in the world? Why not displays of power and conquest and forcing people to do the right thing? What does this say about how I should live my daily life?

<u>Questions for Discussion:</u> Because he brought together the expectations of the Messiah as sufferer and as king, Jesus has been through everything we can face in life. When have I found Jesus a ready help or a comfort in times of trouble?
