## A NOTE FROM PASTOR JON

I lift up my eyes to the hills from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

### Psalm 121:1-2

This summer, Dean and I put together a series of special worship services using the Psalms as the focal point. We hope you were able to engage with them to experience the Psalms as they were intended in a worship service!

One thing I love about the Psalms is that they use a different style of writing than the other parts of the Bible with which we are more familiar. If the Gospels give us Jesus's biography and the New Testament give us the letters that early church leaders wrote to each other and to their congregations, the lyricism of the Psalms open our hearts, like all poetry and music does, to new experiences and understandings of God.

As we prepared the end of the summer series, I realized that one of the Psalms I didn't get to share about is Psalm 121. This Psalm opens with some of the most famous lines from the book aside from Psalm 23. I often use Psalm as part of the opening to graveside committal services at the conclusion of a funeral. I love the way it simply and lyrically captures one of the core truths about God: we are utterly dependent on God.

We depend on God for our daily bread, for our spiritual health and growth, for the air we breathe, even for the mere fact that we exist. Where does our help come from – it comes the Lord! I often use these words from a helpful focal repetition prayer for me when I need God's help in a difficult moment.

🦉 You might have noticed our sign renovation is complete. We are looking forward to the new ways this will help us reach our community. A huge thank you to the two families who generously donated to provide the funds for this sign!



This is the first year we've been sharing our operating budget financials monthly. You may have seen over the first half of the year that our operating giving was slightly behind budget. I'm glad to report that this has caught back up in July. This is both from non-pledged giving (often from new people) and our pledged giving also catching back up. Thank you!!

This brings us back to within ¼ of a percent of budget. However, our 2022 budget still anticipates a \$40,000 deficit. That deficit developed over the past six years or so due to the gradual decline in giving we have seen for the last 10 years. We do have just over \$200,000 of reserves to cover this deficit for a few years but hope that through reaching new people we will begin to close this gap. We will keep you updated over the years as to how much we anticipate using of those reserves as the year progresses.

### Capital Campaign – We are so close!!!

We are under \$10,000 to go to pay off the building and organ renovations from 2019!! Wow, thank you so much for your extravagant generosity! I can't wait to hold our mortgage burning celebration this fall!

As of August 14, 2022: Our remaining loan balance is \$19,114 Capital Funds receipts balance: \$9,165 **Total needed to pay off loan: \$9,949** 

# **Coming This Fall!**



Have you ever done your taxes, looked down at the number in the income box and wondered where it all went? Ever felt like there wasn't enough money to do all the important things you know you should be doing with it or wonder how to even do the important things
