CHURCH FINANCE 101: WHAT IS AN APPORTIONMENT?

As one person, each of us can make only so much of a difference in the lives of others. But, when we work together with our church family, we can make a much bigger impact for Jesus and with Jesus in the lives of others! In the same way, when you are a part of the United Methodist Church, you are a part of the worldwide ministry of 13,000,000 fellow Christians in about 32,000 connected congregations around the world. How much more impact we can make together!

Here are just a few of the works of the United Methodist Church around the world:

The Nehemiah Mission, an outreach to those in poverty in west Cleveland

Africa University, providing professional training and college level education in south-central Africa.

Administrative funds, supporting the supervision and organization of clergy and missionaries and the work of ministry both here and around the world.

Support for United Methodist college students in all study areas and specific support for pastors studying for licensed and ordained ministry.

Projects around the world that provide clean water, church planting, schools, hospitals, career training, agricultural education, children's ministry, and so much more in the name of Jesus Christ!

So, who pays for these projects that impact lives around the world? Who pays for the organization to make them happen, and happen safely? We all do, through apportionment giving.

Each congregation has its share of the total work of the church around the world. Each month, each local church forwards their apportionment of around 10% of their total budget to their annual conference. A lion's share of those funds supports their conference, a regional ministry area – ours is the East Ohio Conference. Another part of those funds is forwarded on to the worldwide church to fund the projects and work I described above.



In that way, we all get to participate, even if only a small fraction of our individual financial giving, in the whole work of the whole connected church around the world!
