I've had the honor to spend time over the years with many people in the days when they know their end is close. It's a wonder to observe how certain things become higher and higher priorities

as those moments come closer. I remember this especially when I was spending time with Ginny Folk over her last few days. She and Ted were my marching band chaperones and I always enjoyed when they were with us because they were so loving and fun. Over Ginny's last few days it seemed like she spent every moment and breath giving words of encouragement, blessing, and love the many, many people who were dear to her in life. It seemed like the way Jesus would have done it.

From the cross, Jesus used his last few breaths to make sure that his mother was cared for, to pray for forgiveness for those who harmed him, and to say, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" I'd always thought those words were a cry of anguish, until one day a few years ago I was reading Psalm 22 and recognized them as the first line of the Psalm. Jesus used some of his last words (perhaps his very last words according to Mark 15), to begin a Psalm that praises God's enduring power and reign. As if to say, God's got this.

Whenever those days come, I'm hoping I use my last days and moments as wisely as Jesus and Ginny.

After worship on September 18 and 25 (in-person) we will show a brief video explanation of the poll, then conduct the one question poll. It should take you about 15 minutes or less. Please bring a smartphone or tablet if you have one.
