FATAL ERRORS

WAS THE RICH MAN'S MISTAKE ISN'T BEING TOO RICH?

VS. 24 – DOES THE RICH MAN THINK LAZARUS IS HIS SERVANT?

LUKE 16:9 – HAS HE USED ANY OF HIS WEALTH TO MAKE FRIENDS?

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

VSS. 19-20 - RICH MAN WEARS LINENS, LAZARUS IS COVERED IN SORES

VS. 20 - LAZARUS IS THE ONLY NAMED PERSON IN THE PARABLES

VS. 21 – JESUS CONTRASTS THE RICH MAN NOT WITH LAZARUS BUT THE DOGS

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION: IN DEUTERONOMY 24:19, GOD'S PEOPLE WERE INSTRUCTED TO LEAVE SOME OF THEIR HARVESTS IN THE FIELD FOR WIDOWS, ORPHANS, AND IMMIGRANTS IN THEIR LAND. THIS ALLOWED THOSE WHO WENT WITHOUT FOOD TO GLEAN FROM THE FIELDS, AS RUTH DOES FROM BOAZ'S FIELDS IN THE BOOK OF RUTH.

This practice is often cited as an instruction against gluttony — the sin of consuming more than we need. If they had eaten all of what grew in their fields, the widows and others would have gone without. What if you bought a little extra food each week to donate to the local food bank? What other ways could you practice this act of compassion to combat gluttony today?

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION: OF ALL THE CHARACTERS IN JESUS'S PARABLES, THE ONLY ONE TO WHOM JESUS GIVES A NAME IS LAZARUS. THIS NAME IS THE GREEK FORM OF THE HEBREW NAME, ELEAZAR, WHICH MEANS, "GOD HAS HELPED." (JESUS LATER RAISES HIS FRIEND, LAZARUS, FROM THE DEAD. SAME NAME, DIFFERENT PERSON.)

THE SOWER, THE RICH MAN, THE WOMAN WHO LOST A COIN, EVEN THE FATHER AND PRODIGAL SON ARE ALL UNNAMED IN JESUS'S PARABLES. WHAT DO YOU THINK JESUS WAS TRYING TO TELL US BY GIVING ONLY THIS POOR, SICK MAN WHO WAS "CAST OFF" AT THE RICH MAN'S GATES A NAME TO BE REMEMBERED?
