



A NOTE FROM PASTOR JON

Over the last two weeks, (and yet once more on a brief ZOOM call after worship on 10/2), our congregation has been completing a one question survey about the future of the United Methodist Church. We are anticipating that in either 2024 or 2028, the UMC will allow churches and pastors to start performing marriages for LGBTQ persons and conferences to be able to ordain LGBTQ pastors. Churches and pastors won't be forced to do so, but they will have the ability to do so if they choose.

The categories were given to the UMC by Tom Lambrecht, one of the pastors who is leaving because he prefers to serve a church that only allows marriage between men and women.

- **Progressive Non-Compatibilist:** Supports same-sex marriage and ordination of LGBTQ persons, NOT willing to be in a church with people who disagree
- **Progressive Compatibilist:** Supports same-sex marriage and ordination of LGBTQ persons, willing to be in a church with people who disagree
- **Traditional Compatibilist:** defines marriage between man and woman and against ordination of LGBTQ persons, willing to be in a church with people who disagree
- **Traditional Non-Compatibilist:** defines marriage between man and woman and against ordination of LGBTQ persons, NOT willing to be in a church with people who disagree

Here is the rough breakdown of our congregation's responses so far (with a few yet to come in via the ZOOM call.)

Progressive Non-Compatibilist: 4% **Progressive Compatibilist:** 52%

Traditional Compatibilist: 33% Traditional Non-Compatibilist: 11%

As you can see, our active congregation leans slightly more progressive in general. This was a little bit of a surprising, as I thought we might be closer to the center. However, if you look at compatibility, we are overwhelmingly willing to be in church with people who don't agree with us. I think one of the great strengths of our congregation is that we recognize that the mission of Jesus transcends some of our disagreements.

We will use this data over the next few years to continue to lead through the possibility of denominational change. If you are having trouble imagining being part of a congregation that might practice same-sex marriage, I would encourage you to reach out to me. I truly respect that position and would prayerfully hope to help find a way that you can stay or be helpful to you as you look for a place where your conscience can be at peace.

As I have always done, I will continue to point us toward where Jesus is and where I believe he is leading us to go. Thank you.
