Grace, Famous In Deed

vs. 13 – where did the Tax Collector get the idea he could be forgiven?!

Colossians 3:13 – we, the Church, bear the good news that God forgives

Questions for Reflection: This parable teaches us that God grants grace and mercy based on our humility, not our ability to hold it all together. Weakness and brokenness need not be obstacles to our receipt of God's mercy. If we allow it, they can be means through which God demonstrates power, mercy, and grace to us and to others around us. How might God's power be shown today through a weakness or brokenness in your life? Who in your life needs to see God is at work in your weakness or brokenness?

Question for Discussion: The Bible is filled with heroes who were used by God despite their flaws and weaknesses. To name just a few: Abraham deceived two kings about Sarah's identity, Jacob was lied regularly, Moses was a hothead, and Elijah and Jeremiah battled depression and discouragement. How does this reality that God uses regular, flawed people affect your belief that God will work through you?

Memory Verse: Colossians 3:13 – "Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive."
