God always gives more depth when we keep on practicing our faith

Questions for Reflection: The rules of early Methodists were simple. The first two are: Do no harm and Do Good. It's fairly natural to, in self-reflection, measure ourselves to the first: remembering we may have said a cross word or made a selfish choice that harmed others. It's often harder to pay close attention to how we have done good. To notice that you took time to rest when you needed it, ate well, prayed, or went out of your way to help someone.

Is there a practice that could help you notice and recall how you have done good? A journal to record how you did harm and how you did good each day? A regular practice of reflecting back on the

things you accomplish to care for yourself and others? It's good for our souls to not only work on what

we need to be better, but notice when you have been better, too.

Questions for Discussion: What do you think God's first words to you will be in heaven? What questions

might God ask us?
