This season of Lent the churches of Church Square have partnered to provide a number of wonderful chances to worship and enjoy study and fellowship with other area churches.. Two Lenten studies are being offered as well as combined services for the special Lenten worship opportunities.

Studies

The Practice of the Presence of God by Brother Lawrence, will be the basis of the first study. We will use it to explore a life of worship. It will be led by Pastor Karol and done with the New Fellowship Sunday School class. It will begin on Sunday, February 26 at 9:45 a.m. and last for 6 weeks.

A joint study with our two neighboring churches will begin on Monday, February 27, at 7 p.m. It will take place at St. John's Episcopal and will be led by our 3 pastors and the pastors at the other 2 churches. It will last for 5 weeks.

Ash Wednesday: February 22, at 7 p.m. First Christian Church will host with Pastor Karol Lewis preaching.

Maundy Thursday: April 6, at 7 p.m. First UMC will host with Father Brian Bechtel (St. John's) preaching.

Good Friday: April 7, at 7 p.m. St. John's Episcopal will host with Pastor Jon Priebe preaching.

Easter Sunrise Service: April 9, at 6:30 p.m. Pilgrim UCC will host with Pastor Mike Ward preaching.

Regular Easter Sunday Services will, of course, take place here at First Church at 9 and 11 a.m.

The Lenten worship series at First Church will begin on Sunday, March 5, and is called "He Gets Us." We will be taking a deep look at each of the days of Holy Week.

In addition, beginning Thursday, February 23, and every Thursday through April 6, organist, Dean Wagner will present noon-time devotional recitals of music appropriate for lent. Each will be about 30 minutes long.



First Church Feeds... At our monthly distribution, we give out more than food. We are often able to get items like soap, paper towels, and pet food from the Food Bank. However, personal hygiene items, especially bladder control products for men and women (such as Poise pads or disposable underwear) are frequently requested by our clients but are rarely available from the Food Bank. We would love to be able to offer these products on a regular basis.

Blessing Box... our blessing box certainly lives up to its name by blessing those in the community who need assistance with food. If donating items, please avoid items in glass, as these may shatter and injure someone due to the cold weather. Items may be placed in the box directly, or brought inside and placed on the donation table located outside the church library. We are starting to run low on items, so please consider donating canned foods, individual oatmeal packets, ramen noodles, individual fruit cups, individual mac-n-cheese, travel size hygiene items, etc...
