Lenten Studies: We are offering two Lenten studies this year.

The Practice of the Presence of God by Brother Lawrence, will be the basis of the first study. We will use it to explore a life of worship. It will be be led by Pastor Karol and done with the New Fellowship Sunday School class. It will begin next Sunday, February 26 at 9:45 a.m. and last for 6 weeks.

A joint study with our two neighboring churches will begin on Monday, February 27, at 7 p.m. It will take place at St. John's Episcopal and will be led by our 3 pastors and the pastors at the other 2 churches. It will last for 5 weeks.

They are currently asking for small electric kitchen appliances, bedding, and gloves (work style NOT cotton as they have enough of these currently) to be sold in the store they operate. Donations may be placed in the bin located outside the church library.

Walk to Emmaus: Have you taken part in the Walk to Emmaus, either locally or in a different state or country? We would like to put together a participant list of people who have. Please send Pastor Mike the following information: name, phone number, email address, and your Walk information.

Weekday Christian Preschool: Registration has begun for the 2023-2024 school year. We offer a Christian preschool program for children who will be 3, 4, or 5 years old by September 30, 2023. The program is state licensed and staffed with degreed lead teachers and trained teachers' assistants. We believe that learning takes place through discovery and play. Each classroom environment is child led and teacher facilitated. Our main objective is to foster a positive self-image in each child while nourishing their social, emotional, physical and intellectual growth.

Vacation Bible School: VBS this summer will be June 19 - 23 with morning sessions for preschool through 4th grade, a SERVE program of field trips and mission projects for 5th and 6th graders, and an afternoon extension program with activities and field trips called EXTREME. We are looking for people who are interested in spending time with our children either as a teacher or helper. We need a wide variety of skills for the different activities, so there are many opportunities for you to use your talents. Questions for Reflection: After their mountaintop experience, these disciples are led down the mountain and into the crowds that needed Jesus's help. Back to the busyness of their day-today and toward, they were told, the difficulty of witnessing their rabbi suffer in Jerusalem. In fact only Thomas spoke up among the twelve to say they should go and suffer with Jesus in Jerusalem. It would certainly be more tempting to remain on the mountain. What motivates my desire to follow Jesus and where am I willing to follow him? How am I tempted to stay on comfortable mountaintops rather than enter into the difficulties and suffering of others?

<u>Question for Discussion</u>: St. Richard's prayer suggests that our ability to follow Jesus is dependent on our love for him, which is dependent on our seeing him. How do you make time for perceiving Jesus in your daily life?

<u>Memory Verse</u>: Deuteronomy 6:5 – "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might."
