Matthew 27:1-11 (New Testament p. 31/30)

When morning came, all the chief priests and the elders of the people conferred together against Jesus in order to bring about his death. They bound him, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate the governor.

When Judas, his betrayer, saw that Jesus was condemned, he repented and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders. He said, 'I have sinned by betraying innocent blood.' But they said, 'What is that to us? See to it yourself.' Throwing down the pieces of silver in the temple, he departed; and he went and hanged himself. But the chief priests, taking the pieces of silver, said, 'It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, since they are blood money.' After conferring together, they used them to buy the potter's field as a place to bury foreigners. For this reason that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. Then was fulfilled what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah, 'And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of the one on whom a price had been set, on whom some of the people of Israel had set a price, and they gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord commanded me.'

Which Jesus?

Matthew 27:17 – Barabbas and our Lord have the same name

Jesus is the Greek form of Joshua which means "the Lord is salvation"

A Crowd is Fickle

Matthew 27:22 - The crowd's shouts of Hosanna turned to "crucify him"

Jesus's victory brought Salvation through his death, not the deaths of others

Questions for Reflection: The crowds seem to have turned on Jesus in part because of a susceptibility to the influence of the religious leaders of the day. However, the roots of this vulnerability are exposed by Pilate's offer to release either Jesus the Messiah or Jesus Barabbas, the revolutionary. One will transform the world through his death and resurrection while the other sought to change the world through the deaths of others. Am I more inclined to seek to change the world by changing others or by my own transformed actions?

Question for Discussion: In Matthew 21, the crowds call Jesus "Son of David," "the one who comes in the name of the Lord," and a "prophet." His name means, "the Lord saves." Pilate notes that he is also being called "the Messiah." What do these names of Jesus mean to you?
