# STATE OF THE CHURCH 2023 SUMMARY

At the end of May, we'll be welcoming the first class of new members who have completed our discipleship pathway. Including our confirmation students, we will have received ten new members just in the month of May! This is just one of the many signs I see around the church this year that our congregational life is rejuve-nating after the hard years of COVID. Several of these adult new members have never been a member of a congregation as an adult – this will be their first time professing their faith in Christ as part of a local church!

Our Arts Series has begun again, with concerts for Dean's 35th anniversary, an Irish group called Shenanigans

on St. Patrick's Day, and a recent concert with the wonderfully gifted choral music composer Craig Courtney. In the past year, our congregation has met the tangible and spiritual needs of our neighbors through Family Promise, First Church Feeds, Soup's On, Open M, support groups, mission trips, Habitat for Humanity, bedclothes for children in at-risk homes, hats for children in the ICU at Children's Hospital, and preparing meals for refugees in Ukraine, among many other projects. And in addition to our new classes that are part of our discipleship pathway, our Women's Bible study started back up and many of our small groups like Men's Time Out, had already started back.



Looking ahead into the rest of 2023 and beyond, our strategic priorities will be even more important to help our congregation grow as we seek to meet the needs of our community. We have developed some **New Worship Expressions**, now we will need to look at new ways to create space for new people. We have built a more robust **Discipleship** pathway. Now we will need to find new **Recreation and Activity** ministries and ways to be a **Community Presence** in transformative ways. We will need to build on our **New Mission Partnerships** like with Heart 4 the City and the Food Bank to meet the needs of new people. All these priorities will help us as we seek to grow into a congregation that is more diverse and able to meet the needs of our increasingly diverse community.
