Questions for Reflection:

Can you imagine if God asked you to leave behind everything that was familiar to you to go to a foreign land where you didn't know anyone? How you think you would respond to God? We can trust that when God calls us to do something, He will be glorified and we will be blessed for our obedience. What are some challenges you have faced in obeying God? Why do we as Christians (followers of Christ) try to ignore a calling that He places in our hearts?

Questions for Discussion:

How are we called to be a blessing to this world? Can we be a curse to this world? How can you be a healing presence in your home, in your community, and in your church? How can we live and work to share the message of faith with those who live without it? God promised Abram 3 things (He would be a great nation, the world would be blessed through his family, & God would give the land of Canaan to them). What has God promised you?
