<u>Questions for Reflection:</u> In Psalm 139, the psalmist concludes with a daunting prayer, "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts." What will God find if I allow my heart to be searched like this?

<u>Question for Discussion</u>: The night at the Jabbok gave Jacob a chance to prepare for what he no doubt expected to be a cold welcome from his brother whom he'd attempted to defraud. All night, Jacob wrestled with an angel before God. What sorts of things have caused you to wrestle before God? Did that experience help or hinder your faith?
