Listening to the hearts of others is Christ-like work

<u>**Prayer Challenge:**</u> How are you doing praying for your neighbors? Use a "neighbor map" to identify eight homes near you. Do you know the names of the persons who live there? How might you learn their names and introduce yourself?

<u>Questions for Reflection</u>: Jesus asked 307 questions in the Gospels but only answered three, according to an observation in *Jesus is the Question* by Martin P Copenhaver. Listening is a great way to show others the love of God! What questions could I use to get to know the people at my school or workplace or the businesses I frequent?

<u>Question for Discussion</u>: How could you work with other Christians (your family, small group, or class perhaps) to show your neighbors that you notice them and hear them? Could you celebrate special days or events in their lives (birthdays, etc)? Could you organize a gathering so everyone could meet each other?
