Paradigm Shift

John 13:5 – Why did Jesus wash his disciple's feet?

Guests' feet were customarily washed by a servant of the host

B.L.E.S.S.

vs. 3 – Jesus, king of the universe, holds all things in his hands

vs. 5 – yet he also chose to hold their feet in those same hands

following Jesus causes a reorientation of our relationships with others

Questions for Reflection: By washing his disciples' feet (even Judas who would betray him and Peter who would deny him) Jesus reveals how upside-down the world is without him. The least is the greatest; those who are first shall be last and the greatest shall be the servant of all.

How has serving another revealed this reorientation of the world to you? What would need to be reorganized in your life to make room to serve your neighbor this way?

Question for Discussion: How does the image of Jesus, King of the Universe, kneeling to wash his disciples' feet sit with you? Imagine if other powerful people in our world took this posture. How might the world look different?
