

THE STATE OF THE CHURCH 2023

2023 was a year of transition, with goodbyes to Pastor Mike and Pastor Karol. While we miss them and their gifts, we are pleased to know they are thriving in their new appointments. Pastor Pippin has leapt into the ministry here with grace and gusto and we are so pleased to have not missed a beat.

This fall, we began a new worship schedule with both the Epworth and Chancel choirs singing weekly at the 10:30 service and communion being served weekly at the 8:30 service. Both services have taken shape with their unique joyful character. We continue to be blessed by our Art Series Concerts, two children's choirs, and several bell choirs as part of our music and worship program. We are giving glory to God and meaning to our congregation through passionate worship!

In May, we welcomed our first class of new members through our new discipleship pathway. These families completed a series of classes and shared when they joined how they are getting involved. We have several families serving in various missions and children's ministries as well as a new member on our Finance committee. Discipleship is also flourishing among our current members, with almost all of our adult Bible study groups and Sunday school classes back and most meeting in-person. We are grateful for the ways discipleship is forming the core of our congregational DNA.

Several of our missions have transformed themselves through COVID, including Soup's ON which now serves over 100 meals to clients of Good Neighbors in a new community partnership. We also serve over 50 persons, on average, with our First Church Feeds that provides a full month of fresh and non-perishable groceries. This began as a transformation of our Preston backpacks of food for children in need and has bloomed into a wonderful way to meet the needs of our community. In addition, this year we are restarting our Preston school backpacks program as God continues to grow new and old ministries through our congregation.

Our finances are strong, but we did identify a budget deficit during COVID that has been met by grants and over and above giving from the congregation for the past two years. We are beginning to make staff cuts to close some of this deficit and will begin using reserve funds in 2023. Several stewardship and endowment programs are in place to increase pledged giving and grow the Music and Worship endowment to support our music and worship budget expenses including music staff. These plans hope to bring the budget back into balance by 2025.

At the end of 2022, we paid off (early!) the mortgage from our 2018 sanctuary and organ renovation project. Our beautiful sanctuary is used regularly for worship, children's programs through our preschool, concerts, and even the occasional staff meeting.

God has been faithful in 2023, the 193rd year of the ministry of First Church.
