

ZOE EMPOWERS AT CHRISTMAS

In the last few years at First Church, we have seen radical generosity at work through our Christmas missions offerings. We've supported relocated refugees from Afghanistan and supported Coshocton Grace UMC's rebuilding project after their devastating fire. Last year alone we gave around \$10,000 in this special offering; in celebration of the loving gift of God's son, we have been giving to those in need most during the season of giving!

This year, we are embracing a tremendous opportunity to broaden our Christmas generosity. We'll be starting a three year commitment to support a cohort of vulnerable orphans in Zimbabwe through ZOE Empowers as a part of their push to transform the lives of 250,000 orphans, their families, and their communities across the world.

ZOE was started in 2007 by United Methodists from North Carolina and a social worker in Rwanda, using an empowerment model rather than a traditional charity model. A cohort of orphans is connected to business and agriculture leaders, educators, clergy, and other mentors who help the young person learn to support themselves (and potentially younger siblings), receive the medical care they need, know their rights, and give back to their own community as they grow into adulthood. ZOE graduates learn how to become entrepreneurs, providers, and leaders to make a positive difference for themselves and for the next generations who follow them.

This model is less staff-dependent and significantly more cost-effective, empowering 75 or more orphans for around \$9,500 per year. Spend some time listening to the stories we'll be sharing through Advent at worship and on our social media. Through our special Christmas offering and other fundraising, we will need to raise \$9,500 each year for the next three years. Please give prayerful consideration to how you might be able to help us reach this goal!
