RESTORING THE MASTERPIECE

"You know what happens when a portrait that has been painted on a panel becomes obliterated through external stains. The artist does not throw away the panel, but the subject of the portrait has to come and sit for it again, and the likeness is redrawn on the same material." - Athanasius, On the Incarnation

I remember working with Willa, our musician, to choose music during the Advent season of the first year I served a church. I was mostly familiar with the popular Christmas carols and songs so I was surprised by just how much Christmas music was in our hymnal. One of the songs she introduced me to that year was, "Love Came Down at Christ-

mas." It's still a favorite because, in addition to its beautiful melody, it conveys powerful truths of our Christian faith in simple lyrics. God came down, in Jesus, to begin the work of our salvation. What sign do we see of this? Love that transforms us.

One early Christian leader and writer, Athanasius of Alexandria, compared Jesus's birth to the work of restoring great works of art. In his book, <u>On the Incarnation</u>, he likened the corruption of human nature through sin to the smudging of a great work of art. What happens when a great work of art needs cleansing and repair? Is it thrown away only to start trying to replicate the masterpiece again? Of course not! A great artist touches up the masterpiece.



One of the great miracles of Christmas is the restoration project of God's masterpiece – <u>you and me</u> through Love! Though we were created after the image of God (Genesis 1:27), we chose love of self over the self -giving love of God and sinful actions over the good works that God has planned for us (Ephesians 2:10). But, God did NOT abandon us or throw us away. Instead, God began the work of undoing the harm we had done ourselves and others and making us anew (1 Corinthians 5:17-19). Through the birth, death, and resurrection of God's son, Jesus Christ, the work of restoration has begun.

This Christmas, remember that no matter what you have done, no matter where you have found yourself, no matter how disappointed you may feel, God has not given up on you! You are a masterpiece by the greatest artist in the universe! Allow the restorative work of Christ to forgive you, heal you, and begin to restore again the goodness that God has instilled in you – the very image of the master artist's son.

It is time to sign up to help with dinners again. We must have parents who help at each session. Dinner will be \$4.00 per child/parent again, to be collected at each session.




All the men of the church and community are invited to gather on the


Daniel: Lives of Integrity, Words of Prophecy
