Jesus did not resist...

- vs. 9 ... the call to where sins were being forgiven
- vs. 12 ... the Spirit's leading or temptation

Jesus Did Not Resist the Cross

- vs. 14 He proclaimed the arrival of the upside-down kingdom
- vs. 11 He embraced the cross because he knew whose he was

Questions for Reflection: Some of the most challenging moments of Jesus's life follow the rare appearances of the voice of God in the gospels. Just before he was led into the wilderness where he would be tempted, God's voice reminded him that he was beloved. As he neared Jerusalem, he took a few disciples to a mountaintop where they heard the voice of God call Jesus beloved. You, also, are the beloved children of God. How does this identity shape your life?

<u>Question for Discussion:</u> Jesus was a king who gave his life for his people. He accepted a baptism of repentance that he did not need. He achieved victory through the cross where he was a victim. To give us life, he laid down his own. How does Jesus's way of ruling in power as the King differ from the ways humans use power?

Memory Verse: Mark 1:15 – "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe the good news."
