Hine-ni – "Here Am I"

hineni – the response given in Hebrew by a servant when called

when we need direction, God speaks to us in the ways we can hear

<u>Questions for Reflection:</u> When God called someone in the Bible, they often replied with "Hineni," which means "Here am I." It was the way servants responded to their masters, and children to their parents. It conveyed availability and willingness for what the person who was calling needed. When you take your time for devotions and prayer this week, begin with *Hineni* and presenting yourself to God for whatever God wills. Journal about how this affects your prayer and devotional time.

Question for Discussion: Who are the mentors in your life that, like Eli did, have helped guide you? How did their shared wisdom make a difference for you?
